

# NEXT WEEK AT COLQUITZ

Sept. 6-9, 2022

The school year will begin on Tuesday, September 6th. On this day, all grade 6 students will attend from 9:30am – 11:30am, and our grade 7 and 8 students will attend from 10:30am – 11:30am. When students arrive on campus they should go to the basketball court outside the band room and check the bulletin boards to find out which division they are in. When they have their division number they should find the teacher holding that division number and line up in front of them. Students should check in with their teacher who will be taking attendance. Support staff will be on hand to help with this process. Once all divisions are collected, students will be led by their teachers to the gymnasium for a brief assembly.

We will resume our regular school hours on Wednesday, September 7th. Our usual hours are 8:40am - 2:49pm. Nutrition break is from 10:18am - 10:33am. Lunch is from 11:57am - 12:42pm. We are a closed campus, so unless they have an outside appointment, students are required to stay on school grounds for the entire school day.

Busses will not be running on Tuesday. For those students using the district school buses, passes will be given out on Tuesday with service beginning Wednesday morning.
