## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Hello Colquitz Families,

I have an important issue to share with you today around traffic safety, because at Colquitz, safety for students, staff, and our wider community is our number one priority.

We have received a number of concerned phone calls and emails from neighbours who are worried about unsafe driving and parking around the school. It is important that we be kind, respectful and safe of our community, and we appreciate everyone doing their part to ensure this. **For example, people should not be parking close to crosswalks,** 

nor in our bus zones. People should also not block driveways to drop off or pick up, nor use driveways to turn around.

One solution we encourage families to consider is to use more active transport to get to school (walking, biking, scootering and skateboarding), and if in a car, to drop off further away from the school or park a couple of blocks away to avoid congestion. We also encourage you to leave the house 5-10 minutes earlier to allow for more time to drop off further away. Lastly, please plan your route so that you can drop off/pick up and keep going in the same direction. Along with benefits to traffic congestion, it builds student independence and wellness to walk, bike, scooter or skateboard (with helmets!), even if it's just from a few blocks away.

Please be aware that Saanich is planning on sending traffic officers to ticket those who display unsafe driving practices or engage in illegal parking.

Thank you to those families and their students who already do this, and thank you for considering this more carefully moving forward.



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## Learning Surveys—Please participate!

Dear Parents and Guardians/Caregivers,

The Student Learning Survey (SLS) has been administered every year in B.C. public schools since 2001. Prior to 2016-17 it was known as the Student Satisfaction Survey. The SLS provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. The SLS is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences through the perspectives of students, parents, guardians/caregivers, and school staff. Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal-setting, and in providing individual students personalized support. In 2021, the student survey underwent a review to accommodate an updated conceptual framework that align questions with the <u>core competencies</u> of the curriculum and the <u>British Columbia's Policy for Student Success</u>.

We've worked - in collaboration with the BC Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils (BCCPAC) to update the parent and guardian/caregiver survey in 2018/19 and make it more useful for parent, guardians/ caregivers, teachers, and schools. Your valued participation is an important contribution to improving the educational experiences of children.

The parent and guardian/caregiver survey is now available online at <u>www.bced.gov.bc.ca/</u> <u>sat\_survey/access.htm</u> and is available in 18 different languages. The survey will be available until Friday, May 3rd, and will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Your responses are voluntary and anonymous, and your child will not be identified as a result of your participation in the survey. Any personal or identifying information will be deleted before results are stored. Data will be stored and accessible only within Canada.

The results of the parent and guardian/caregiver SLS survey will be available through the Ministry of Education and Child Care website (<u>https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey</u>) in summer 2024.
