Health and Wellness at Colquitz

This time of year, we have begun to notice more respiratory illnesses in the school. In an effort to limit the spread of illness in our school community, this is a reminder that the Provincial Guidelines state the importance of not attending school if someone is sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities.

You can support health awareness with regular health checks, which means a person regularly checking to ensure they, or their student, is not experiencing symptoms of illness that would limit their ability to participate fully in regular activities before coming to school. Staff, students, or other persons in the school community can attend school if their symptoms are consistent with a previously diagnosed health condition (e.g., seasonal allergies) or symptoms have improved, and they feel well enough to return to regular activities.

If a person develops symptoms of illness at school and is unable to participate in regular activities, they will be supported to go home and encouraged to stay home until their symptoms improve.

Frequent handwashing is always encouraged and masks can be worn with no prejudice if preferred.

Supporting neurodivergent kids in staying organized can be a challenge, but small changes make a big difference!

■

Use Clear Bins: Make organization easy and visible to support memory and independence. Bins can be easily dumped out to find items then items are easily thrown back in the bin once the item is found. Using labels also helps keep things organized such as "long sleeve tops" vs. "short sleeve tops" and "Warm Pants" vs. "Leggings" etc.

Build Capacity: Add joy before cleaning to make it easier—play a game or offer a sweet treat! Perhaps put on their favourite playlist while they clean so they can pair an undesired task with a desired one! Or Body double by staying in the room with them while working on your computer/phone so you both are getting some much needed work done!

Help Them Get Started: Initiating a task can be tough for ADHD brains—be their cheerleader! Help them get started then once the ball is rolling either body double by staying with them and chatting to them as they clean OR see if you're able to sneak out to work on another task but be sure to check back in case they need you to be there as a body double!

Break It Down: Focus on one area at a time—progress sparks momentum. You can either pick a specific area to work on or a specific task. **Example**:

Task: Put all dirty laundry in the basket, put all clean laundry away

Area: Clean everything off the floor or clean all surfaces or clean one side of the room.

Let's make tidying a team effort and a less overwhelming experience!










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HIGHWAY 1 COLQUITZ BRIDGES PROJECT INFORMATION & UPDATES February 18, 2025





PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Highway 1-Colquitz River Bridges Widening project will widen and seismically retrofit both existing two-lane bridges over Burnside Road on Highway 1 in Victoria, as well as establish a dedicated bus-on-shoulder lane. Widening the Colquitz River bridges will make for a more reliable, efficient commute for south Islanders while protecting local waterways and ecosystems. The Project will provide environmental enhancements by planting native trees, removing invasive species and treating highway runoff via a rain garden before discharging into the Colquitz River. Pomerleau Inc was awarded the construction contract in March 2024 for the project.

PROJECT UPDATES

Construction activities continue to progress onsite, including ongoing widening work on the South and North Colquitz Bridges. All piling works for the project have been completed. The construction crew has continued works for the South Bridge deck extension, including concrete pouring and curing. At the North Bridge, works continued for the installation of the new Bent, including installation of formwork and rebar in anticipation of concrete pouring. Works occured along the Western Median, including additional clearing and grubbing and asphalt removals.

1 MONTH LOOKAHEAD

The following construction activities are anticipated to begin/ continue over the next month:

- · South Bridge concrete curing for the deck work.
- Commencement on the South Bridge parapet.
- Ongoing work for the North Bridge B1 and B2 bents.
- Lane closures, traffic control and temporary crosswalk along Burnside Road West.

PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Regular third-party environmental audits are being conducted throughout construction. The latest audit conducted on February 13th, 2025, included in-situ water quality monitoring and noted the project was in compliance with turbidity levels from measurements conducted midway and downstream of the project.

Tree clearing occurred during the first week of February in the median of Highway 1 west of Colquitz River. This clearing was part of the original design and plan of the project. All trees removed in the median will be replaced with native trees as part of this project.
