Hallowe'en costumes considerations for Families



At Colquitz, we want all students to be mindful of their choices throughout the year in terms of how they might make other people feel.

With Halowe'en coming soon, and in keeping with the Colquitz values of advocating for respect, equity, and appreciation of diversity and inclusion of all (which includes cultural and gender diversity) we wanted to support you in supporting your children in making appropriate choices for their costumes.

Here are some tips in the form of questions to assist you in choosing a costume.

Ask yourself:

- Is my /my child's costume depicting and perpetuating a stereotype or stigma associated with a particular race, culture, religion or gender?
- Does my /my child's costume include a replication of a garment that is a significant component of a particular religion or culture of which I /we do not identify with?
- Is my /my child's costume depicting a historical time-period where that look/costume is now considered offensive and discriminatory?
- Does my /my child's costume represent elements of a culture or cultural practice that is being commoditized for consumption?
- Can I look in the mirror and confidently say that my /my child's costume choice would not be considered offensive to a particular race, ethnic origin, gender or religion?

Thank you for your help in supporting positive costume choices.

UPDATE

This year for the grade 7/8 tour, we will be traveling to Port Alberni, BC for the Vancou-

ver Island Concert Band, Orchestra, and Choir Festival! The dates will be Wednesday- Thursday April 8 + 9, 2026. Students who are in Band 7/8, Sr. Choir, and Intermediate/Advanced Strings are all invited to go.



Going to a festival is a wonderful opportunity for our students to perform for peers from the mainland and all over the island. We will also get to work with and learn from some wonderful adjudicators, including past and current conductors of the University of Victoria Wind Symphony, and several other excellent educators.

We will have opportunities to listen to other groups who attend as well! We are also hoping to see a show and do an activity while we in Port Alberni!

More information should be available very soon; we are just waiting for enough information and quotes to give a solid estimate. The timings are subject to change depending on the times we perform at the festival.

The registration for the festival has been submitted via mail, and we will release the times as soon as we learn what they are.

Payments will be spread out as much as possible to reduce the strain. Here is the plan as of right now:

- 1. Payment 1 Non refundable deposit due late november (1-2 weeks after initial forms are out)
- 2. Payment 2 due Jan 14
- 3. Payment 3 due Feb 11
- 4. Students who have fundraised into their account will have that amount taken from their third payment, or if they have enough, split between their 2nd and 3rd payment.

The shirts are \$12, and if your student grows, they can be sized exchanged later, given that they are still in good condition.

Even if they do not have their instrument or music, they must attend classes. Students should not be missing band for anything except a field trip during the day, or if they are absent from school.
